Dinner at Pasco; social at 4:00 PM dinner at 5:00 PM

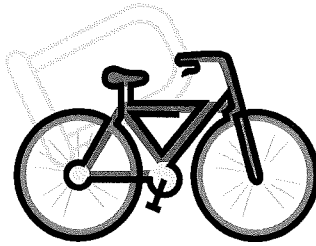

Support Wounded Warriors on the Ride 2 Recovery

Many of our returning veterans need help in recovering from physical and mental injuries; and, the VA has discovered that cycling is a very effective therapy. "Cycling is an important part of the recovery and rehabilitation program for two reasons:

1. Cycling is an activity that almost all patients with mental and physical disabilities can participate.
2. Participation in the Ride 2 Recovery Program helps speed up the recovery and rehabilitation process.

Ride 2 Recovery (R2R) is produced by the Fitness Challenge Foundation, a 501C3 Nonprofit organization, in partnership with the Military and Veterans' Affairs Volunteer Service (VAVS) to benefit Mental and Physical Rehabilitation Programs. The National American Legion Auxiliary learning of this important effort decided that our organization should work with R2R to improve the health and wellbeing of our wounded warriors. In fact, our National President Rita Navarrete, believes so strongly in the ability of the Ride 2 Recovery Program to help our veterans that she has made it her special project for the year. More information on R2R can be found at www.ride2recovery.com.

And just in case you get confused (I did) if they refer to spinning, it is referring to another major supporter of this program. "Spinning" is a worldwide leader in indoor cycling bikes and programs.

Donations are needed to support the participation of wounded warriors in the program and events; and, also provide bikes, helmets, and other technical equipment. The Cycling events can provide needed physical rehabilitation as well as fund raising opportunities. In addition to the monetary donations, I would like to suggest that you contact a couple of the fitness centers in your area and/or the recreation department of your town explaining the R2R Program. Encourage them to join you in putting on an event that would raise awareness as well as money for this very worthwhile program.
